
Material Culture of the Pacific Islands, and Africa

Goals


- Learn about the various arts produced in Africa

Art of Africa

- Before 19th century, outside influences in Africa were mostly Islam (Fatimid dynasty, Mamluk)
- Europeans first visited in 16th century
- In 19th century, explorers charted Africa, and missionaries followed
- Colonization of African society
- Much of Africa's art we study are objects that were used in rituals or daily life.













Islands of Melanesia


- Melanesia means "black islands" for the skin colors of its inhabitants
- New Guinea, islands extending to Fiji and New Caledonia

- Early inhabitants migrated there from Taiwan
- Raised pigs, cultivated taro and yams
- Brought dogs, pigs, and chickens
- Reliance on agriculture, so live in permanent settlements







Islands of Micronesia

- Micronesia means "small islands"
- Small islands and coral atolls.
- Islands to the east share cultural similarities with Polynesia. Those on the west, to Melanesia.
- Known for fine canoes and navigation skills.
- Tattooing important.





Islands of Polynesia

- Polynesia means "many islands"
- Islands settled by Polynesian seafarers included Hawaii and Rapa Nui (after 500 CE) and New Zealand (around 800-1200 CE; Maori culture)
- Pantheon of gods, including ancestors.
- Shared linguistic commonalities
- Social echelon were more rigid than those of Melanesia.
- Arts and their creations were sacred.




What we see today is not necessarily how they appeared when first made.
