Another child started pushing and she stopped and told the teacher saying "Mr.Bance he is pushing me" and the teacher separated him from Mila. As they continued dancing, Mila continue moving her toes and body to the music, hopping and moving around the class with others.

Another observation I've noticed during Free play outside at 4:00. The teacher took the children outside for free play and I noticed Mila loves to play with the Car and makes believe she is driving by pressing the horn and saying "Beep, Beep". She uses her feet and legs to move around with the car and uses her hands to turn the handle.

I think that she is using her body using her gross motor skills, major movements using her fingers, a good way to show what she is expressing using her body, fingers, and her feet. She is feminine and carries the princess mentality, she is a lovely young girl who dresses and carries herself like a little lady. She is strong, fine, and has gross motor skills by using her body to move around, like her feet for jumping, her arms for grabbing, and her hands. I observed her climbing on a chair in her classroom and singing and jumping to songs. She loves using her hand motions by clapping her hands and waving them in the air. Noticed every morning in her class they do a morning dance before having a circle time having them She's very fast at learning. She is tiny but very strong enough to move her body weight around. Mila is slightly smaller than the kids in her class, but even the boys in her class tend to be small as well. She is very active on both activities on what the teacher had them do, asking questions and more.

Social Domain

It was 3:30 after nap time and Mila just started waking up and snack time was coming. For a snack, they received Chocolate chip muffins and cheese with water. One of her friends finished before and Mila shared her snack. She would bring extra snacks for school so she knows that she will have enough to share with others using her communicative skills speaking to her friends asking them they would like more.

Around 4:30 in the afternoon it was almost pick-up time and Mila was playing with the Magna tiles with her friends I noticed that she was using her hands and movement. Mila seeks and is motivated by praise. She enjoys interacting with others. She is strongly attached to her parents. She is very interested in playing with other children. She cries and fuses, when she's not understanding. She shares toys with others in her class, for what witness she told another boy who's was acting silly that he was funny. As she was in a group activity, she did not seek out attention, listened to others, and interacted with them well. During circle time at 9:20 am Mila sat on the carpet with her friends and sang a morning song "Good morning friends how are you? How are you? It's nice to see Mila here "she also sang the days of the week with her teacher. The teacher asked who wants to get up and put what's today's date and Mila said" I do "she went up and changed the weather and the date of today's day on the chart.

Another Observation I've noticed during Free play at 3:30 on Fridays, I've noticed that Mila loves to play with the puzzles and used her to match the puzzles to place them where they belong. She takes a mermaid puzzle and uses her right hand to move the puzzles around to see where they belong. As soon as she matches the piece she acted excited and clapped herself. The teacher asks her if she needs help on the next one she said: " no I'm okay I think I can do it on my own ".

Mila seemed to exhibit high intelligence, especially in comparison with some of her peers in a group meeting. She seems very normal, during the interview she spoke to me about how excited she is to attend another school. Her attention span was very good, her eyes were glued to the video presentation that the teacher showed them and she followed every command her teacher gave her instantly. Even though she may have trouble reading she knew every song in her class. She has excellent memory skills.

Language Development

It was 10:00 a.m and Mila was doing an activity where she was making flamingos. she pasted the feathers and google eyes using glue sticks and using markers or crayons to color. She asked her teacher for help using words in a sentence saying "Ms. A, I need some help please I can't open the glue stick". She would wait and continue trying on her own until the teacher came. She said, "thank you ". As she continued doing the activity, she used the color pink and colored the flamingo using her right hand holding the crayon and the other hand holding the paper. She pasted the glue on the paper and put the google eyes and say "I did it !" I noticed that Mila was very outgoing and communicative when it came to asking for help and wasn't afraid to try on her own.

I noticed Mila likes to do a lot of activities especially when it has to do with using glue sticks and crayons. She communicates very well with her peers and teachers, asking for help when she needs it. She is not afraid to ask for help.

Mila would speak to her peers in the class using her words in complete sentences. "My mom and dad took me to a pumpkin patch this weekend," she told her teachers and her peers. 
Creative Development
