Unit 10: Transformation

To *transform* means to make a thorough or dramatic change in form, appearance or character. To learn this concept, children will begin the unit by considering the question "What changes around me?"

Children may bring up or be thinking about changes in their life that may be sensitive, complex or challenging such as moving homes or changes in their family structure. Children may also have different feelings about preparing to leave the pre-K classroom and entering Kindergarten. Children's play and behavior may reflect their feelings about upcoming transitions

Enduring understandings that the student should have by the end of the unit:

Many things around me change.

There are many ways objects can change.

There are many kinds of changes in nature.

Some things about me change and some things stay the same.
