

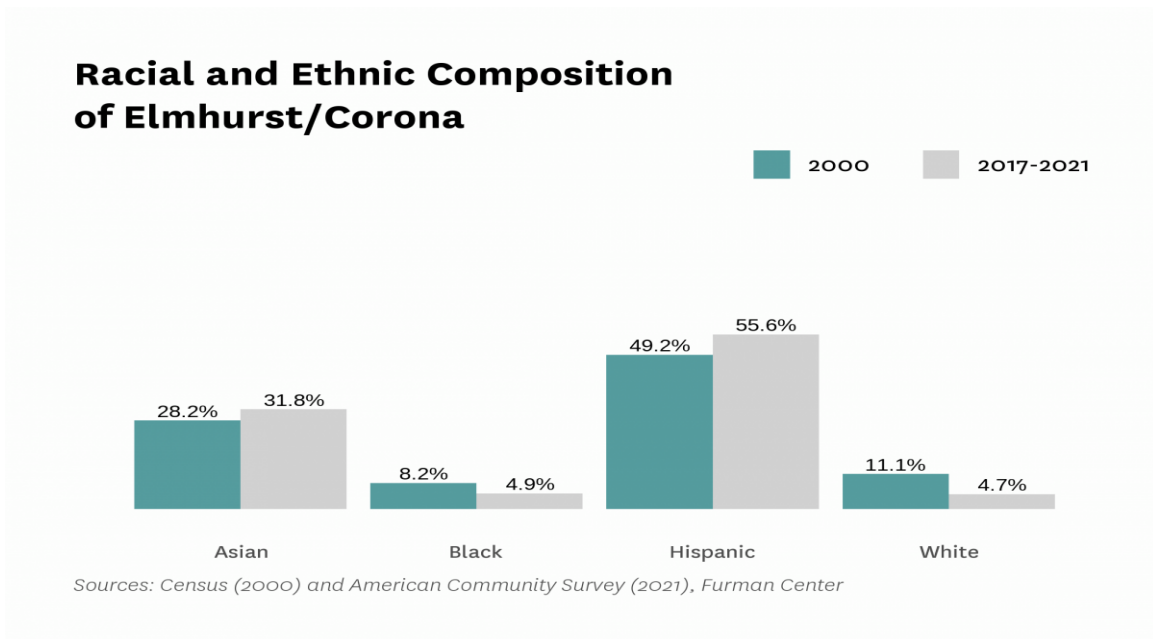

The total population of Corona / Elmhurst, According to New York neighborhood data profiles, in 2021, there were an estimated 137,364 people in Elmhurst/Corona, of which 31.8% identified as Asian, 4.9% identified as Black, 55.6% identified as Hispanic, and 4.7% identified as white. In terms of housing, you can find a range of options including single-family homes, apartments, and multi-unit buildings. Many others rent apartments or live in public housing developments. In terms of income levels, Corona has a mix of both lower-income and middle-income households.

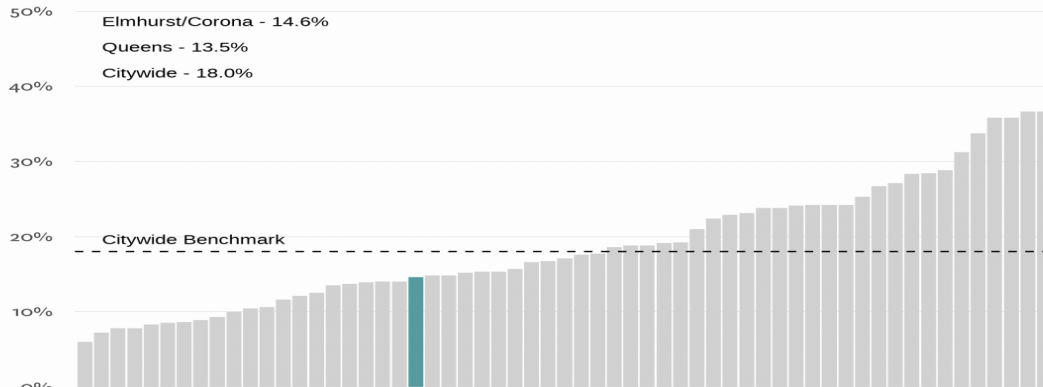


The data table above shows how Hispanics are the majority population followed by Asians then colored people.

Poverty Rate, 2021



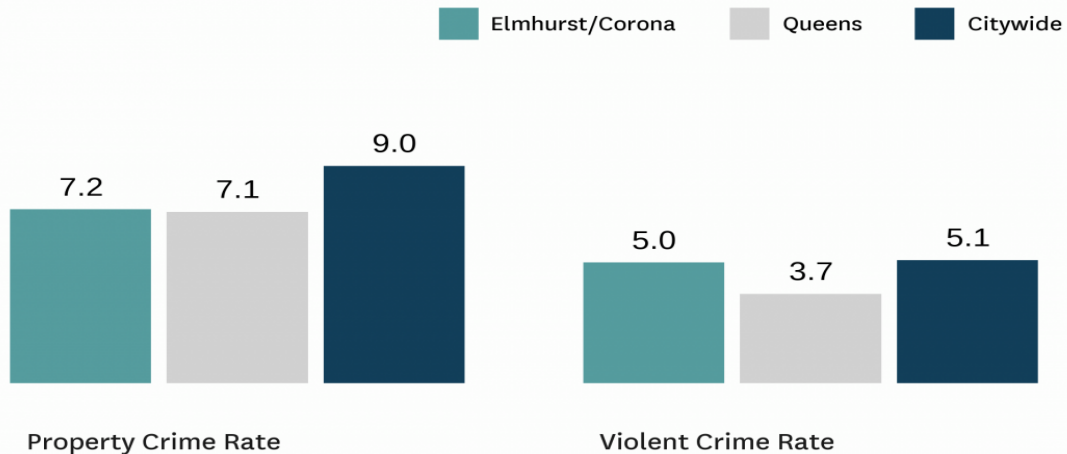

NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME AND CONDITIONS

Most common types of crimes in the area of Corona are property crimes like theft, burglary, and vandalism, as well as occasional incidents of assault or drug-related offenses. According to New York neighborhood data profiles, The serious crime rate was 12.2 serious crimes per 1,000 residents in 2022, compared to 14.2 serious crimes per 1,000 residents citywide.
