

How has the increase of crime affected Bushwick Brooklyn?

### The Past

- Bushwick was initially a neighborhood of Germans, Austrians, English, Irish, Russians, Polish, Jews, and Italians, at one point making it the second-largest American community in Brooklyn. It was a famous entertainment district and the Bushwick Theatre on Broadway between Palmetto and Woodbine. Making it an area that was always clean, the streets were kept well-maintained, and the houses were beautifully maintained.
- An event that changed the phase of Bushwick was the Blackout on July 13, 1977. Hundreds of Bushwick stores were looted, many were destroyed permanently and fires were everywhere. Leaving Bushwick to have a difficult recovery. The population decreased as in 1975 it was at 122,000 residents and in 1980 it was at 93,000. Leaving 43% of businesses vacant in Bushwick economically harming it's Broadway attraction.






### Present

- As of 2019, 4.2% of the population identified as Asian, 15.3% identified as Black, 56.3% identified as Hispanic, and 20.6% identified as White.
- The average household income as of 2019 was \$69,640. This is about 5% less than the citywide median household income of \$72,930, which means that the residents in this neighborhood are earning less than the average income and causing many residents to struggle. The poverty rate in Bushwick was 20.7% in 2019 compared to 16.0% citywide.







## Crime in Bushwick

Being a neighborhood of low-income, crime is a common issue in this area. The precinct of Bushwick is the 83rd precinct. Considered to be one of the highest areas with a lot of crime occurring. The chances of someone becoming a victim in Bushwick is about 1 in 40.

 On this date, you can see that in 2021 property crimes are higher in Bushwick compared to the entire borough of Brooklyn and the whole city of New York.
