

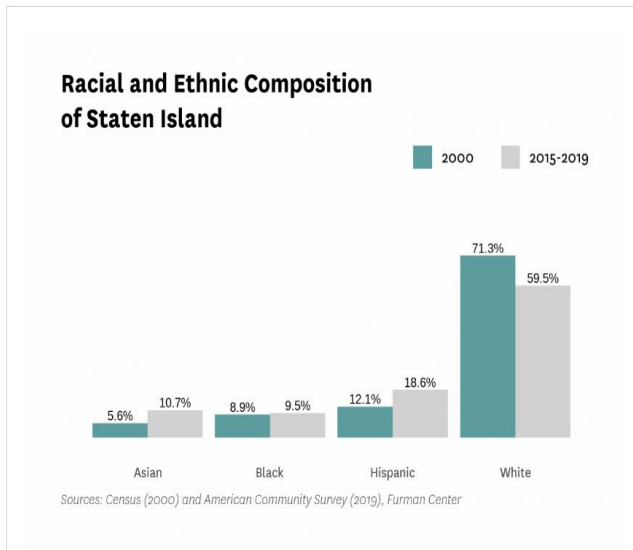

Its grounds also include the Staten Island Children's Museum. — Google

As for the races and population in Staten Island, I will be showing a chart below that's from 2015-2019. In total there are 476,143 people living on Staten Island, 10.7% are Asian, 9.5% are Black, 18.6% are Hispanic, and 59.5% are white. As you can see in the chart below, during the 2000s there were way more white Americans (71.3%) living on Staten Island compared to now.

All of the other races changed slightly increasing but the white population declined and I wonder why.

DEMOGRAPHICS

For misdemeanor assaults in 2021, it shows that 25 people made complaints but in 2022 it shows that it went up a lot, 44 people made complaints during that time.
