

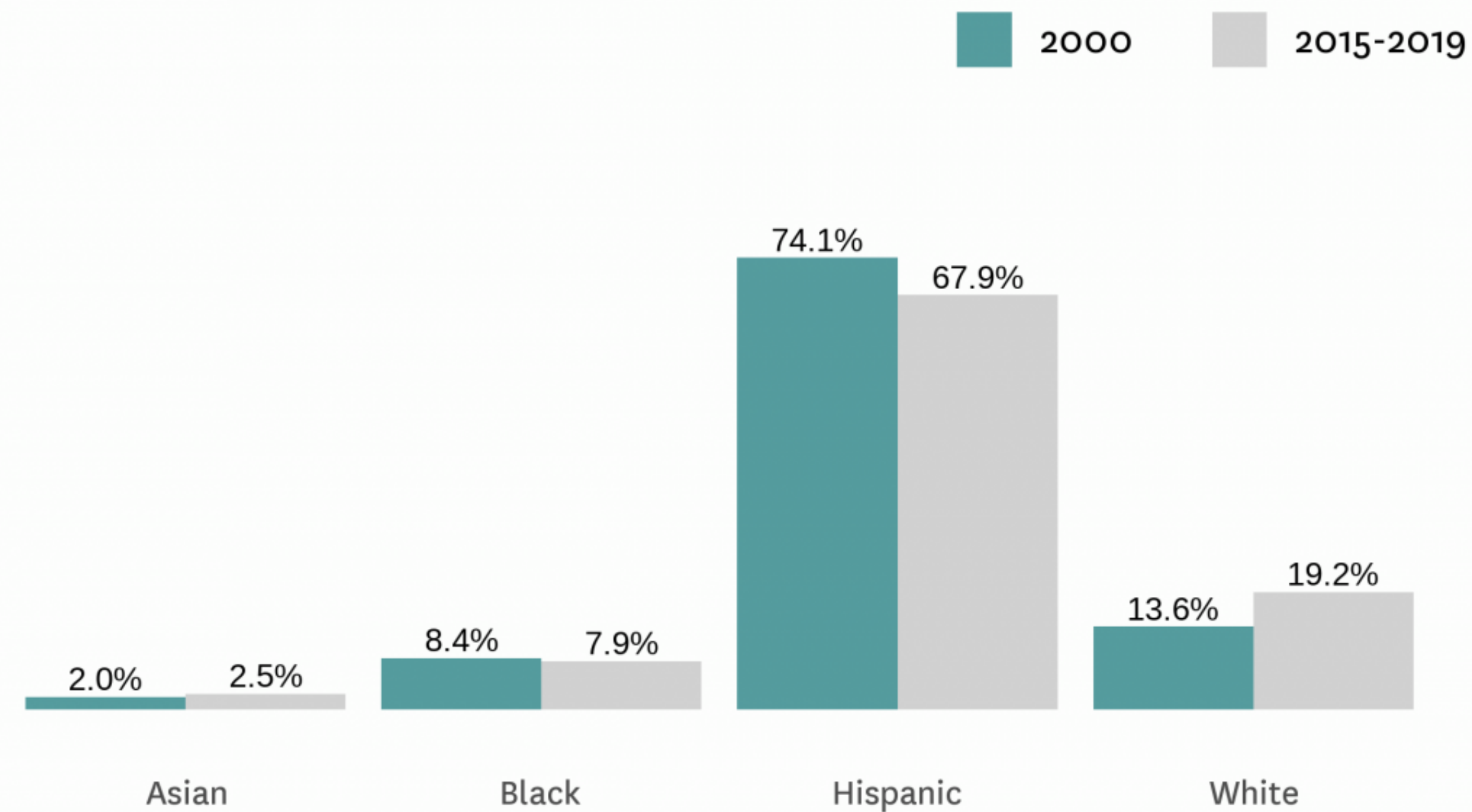
# Washington Heights

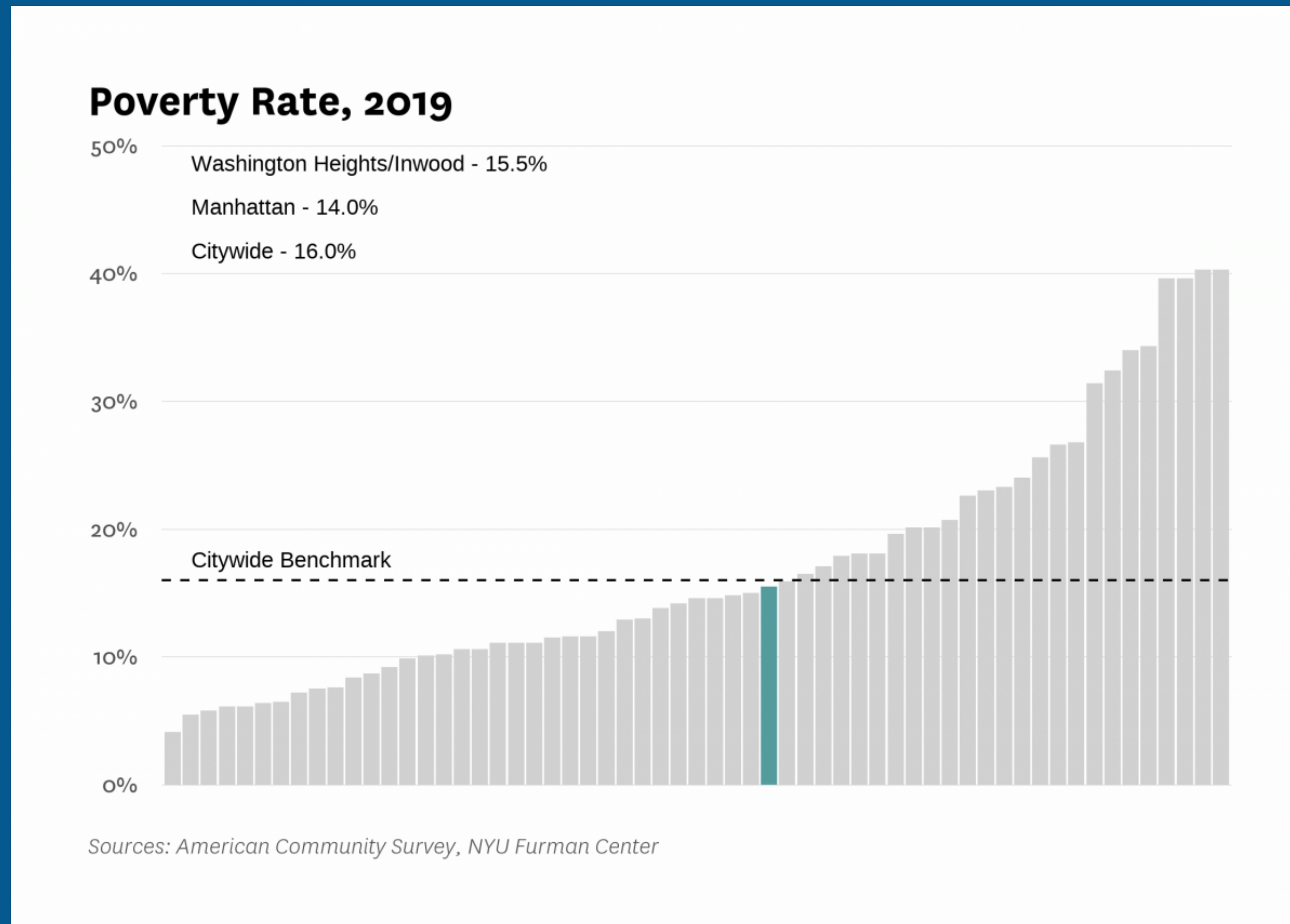

### Racial and Ethnic Composition of Washington Heights/Inwood

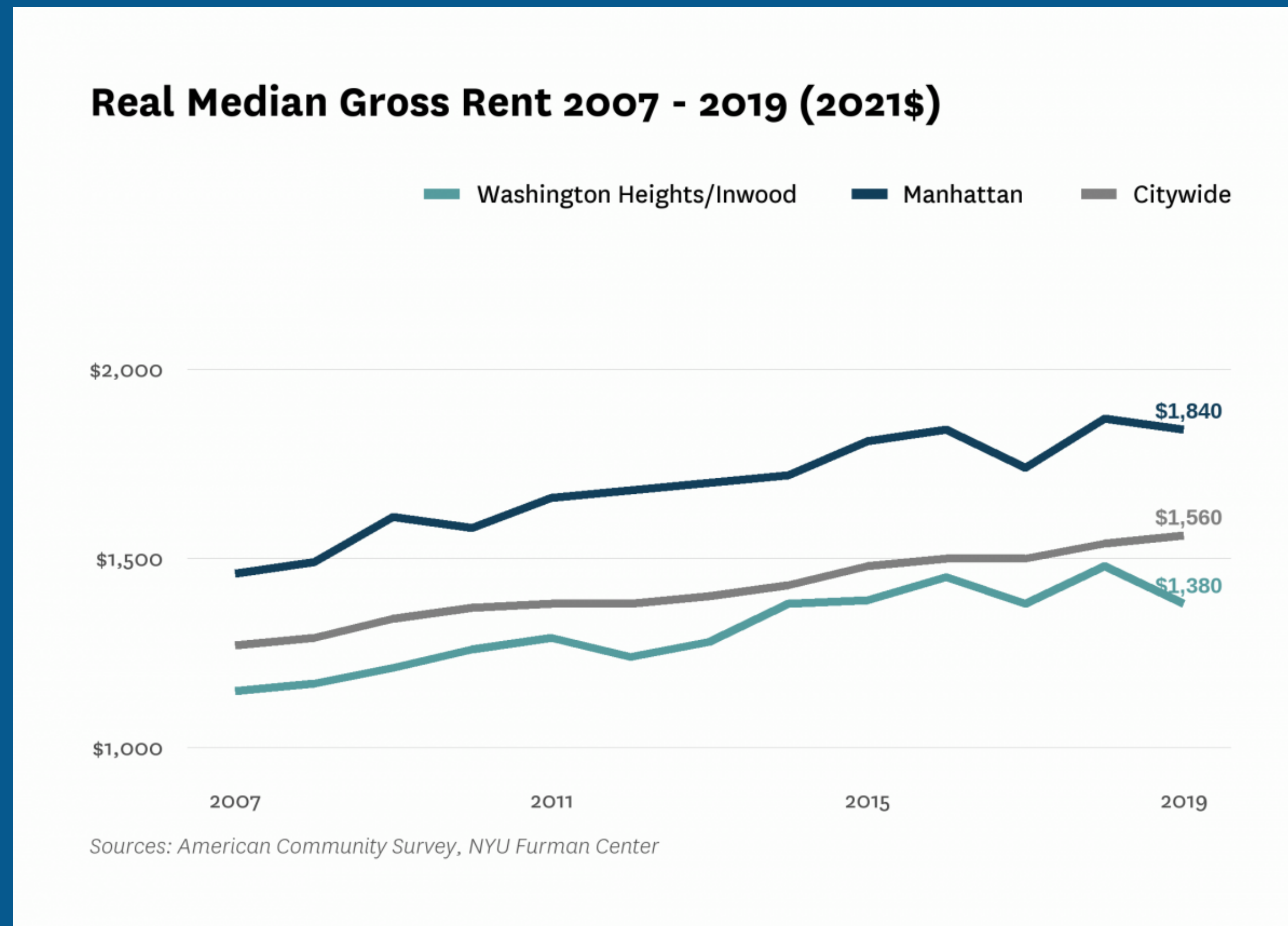

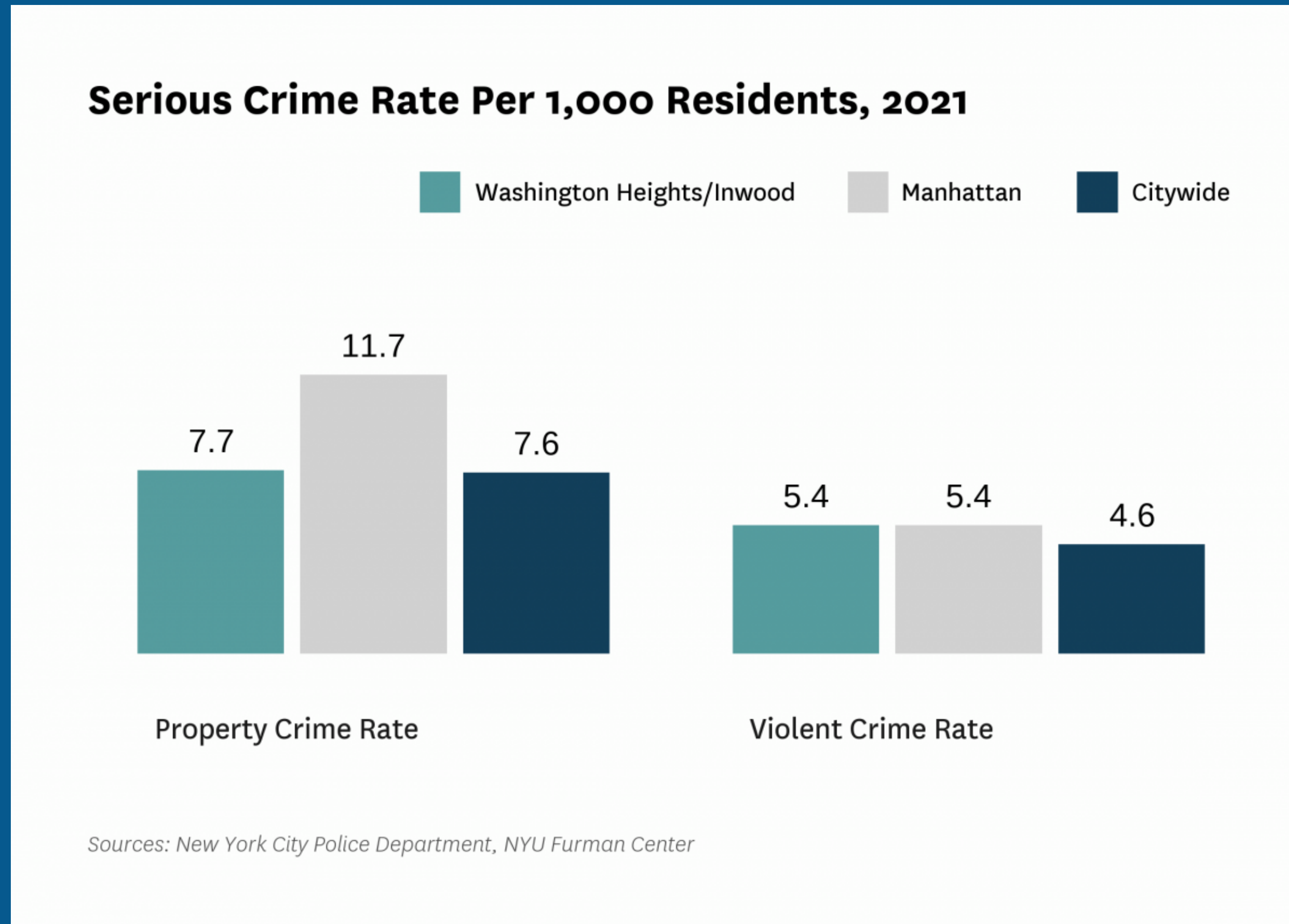
- As we see with this data below the average income in Washington heights was around 23 percent less compared to the city and about average when it comes to the poverty rate
- Median household income in 2019 was \$56,230, about 23% less than citywide median household income (\$72,930). The poverty rate in Washington Heights/Inwood was 15.5% in 2019 compared to 16.0% citywide which is about average.



- This chart shows the median rent in Washington Heights showing how it is below the average amount compared to both Manhattan and the rest of the city. The rent sits at about 1,380 and it is trending downward even more.



- Moving on to the crime statistics When can see with this data that when it comes to property crimes we are about average compared to the city and bellow the rates of Manhattan as a whole. For violent crimes we are slightly above the rates for the city but around equal with the rest of Manhattan



- The incarceration rate in my neighborhood is represented by this chart. There are currently around 72 individuals incarcerated in my community out of around 40,000 people. The rate of imprisonment per 100,000 people is around 178 per 100,000. This shows the low amount of incarcerated individuals in my community compared to other areas.
