

- Collage: Children will be able to make a collage of all the things they love to eat. I will have them describe what special dishes they eat at home





ACTIVITES

- Art: After reading the book Lucy's Picture children will be able to make their own touchable pictures or textured picture using different materials (Pom-poms, dry pasta, cereal, sand paper pieces, Aluminum foil pieces, bubble wrap pieces, feathers)
- Movement: We will play the game Simon Says. Through this listening game children will be able to understand how their sense of touch is guiding them through the steps.
- Textured rubbing: Using textured rubbing plates children will be able to shade with a crayon and observe how these textures create different styles.

ACTIVITIES

- Art and Literacy Extension- After reading What
 Can I smell By Annie Kubler, children will be able
 to draw one thing they love to smell and we will
 make a classbook titled "I like to smell....." The
 book will be placed in our reading center so
 children can reflect on their drawing and also
 learn about their peers
- Children will be given a mirror to observe their nose and describe what they see as well as reflect on what their nose is used for. After they will use playdough to sculpt out their nose.
- After reading What's That Smell By Lauren
 Mclaughlin in the Dramatic play center I will
 place different containers with cotton balls that
 contain different smells of spices. Children will be
 able to pretend play in their restaurant and use
 these spices. They will be able to describe the
 smells and which ones they prefer on their "food"
