Making a Claim

- The sea is blue because the sky is blue.
- Start from a premise (set of assumptions) : The sky is blue
  - Can the premise be validated?
  - Are the assumptions justified?
- Follow a Certain Logic : The sea reflects the color of the sky
  - Are the logical rules reasonable?
  - Are they followed?

When we are trying to evaluate whether we agree with a claim, this can help us identify where the trouble is.

In the next two slides, identify where the claim gets tripped up.

Untested Claims Verifiable but haven't been or cannot presently be

Opinions An untestable belief
