- Please write in the present verb tense for ENG 201 essays.

<u>Use your corrected first draft as the basis for the essay. Do not write a whole new essay.</u>

- Do not simply paste your research summary into the final draft.
- Do not just tag the research summary onto the end of your essay.
- <u>*Do*</u> weave the secondary source information through the body of your essay.
