

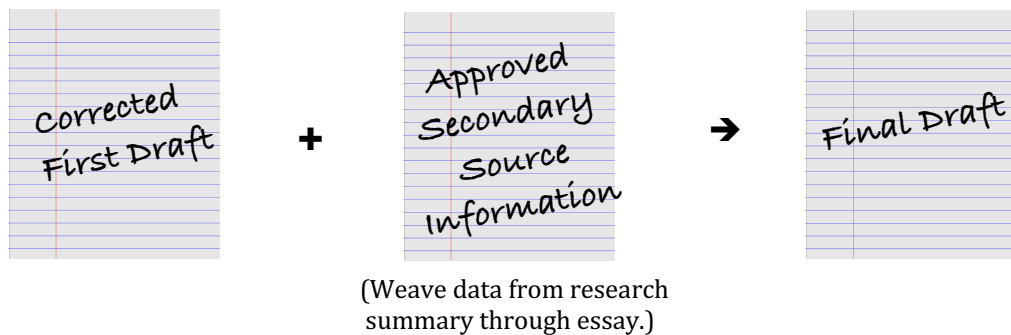
Final Draft Essay Directions

This week you will write a 3-4-page (750-1,000 words) final draft of your essay project. You will expand on the corrected first draft by incorporating at least two direct quotes from your *secondary source* research into the essay.

- Please avoid the “we,” “you,” and “our” points of view in ENG 201 essays. Write in the more academic third person voice.
- Please write in the present verb tense for ENG 201 essays.

Use your corrected first draft as the basis for the essay. Do not write a whole new essay.

- Do not simply paste your research summary into the final draft.
- Do not just tag the research summary onto the end of your essay.
- Do weave the secondary source information through the body of your essay.



OUTLINE

Original Title

(Try to make it interesting!)

Introduction

- **Use your corrected first draft introduction.**

Body

- Use your corrected first draft body
- Incorporate at least 2 quotes from your secondary source into the body

Conclusion

- Use your corrected first draft conclusion

Work Cited Page:

- Include a Works Cited page following MLA format.
