Essay 1 Directions

Please read and follow directions carefully. *Adhere exactly to the outline.*

Write a 2-3-page (at least 500 words) **thesis-driven** essay in which you discuss one of the ideas expressed in "Overview of 'The Most Handsome Drowned Man'" by Dean Rader *(secondary source)* about the story by Gabriel Garcia Marquez *(primary source)*.

- Please write in the present verb tense for ENG 201 essays.
- Avoid generalizations and observations that are outside the bounds of the literary text you are discussing.
- Be very specific and give details.
- Do not critique/compliment the author or attempt to define what the author's intent is with respect to the reading audience.
- Follow all formatting guidelines.

OUTLINE

Original Title

(Try to make it interesting!)

Introduction

- Identify the title and author of the *primary* source (the story). Give a very brief 2-3-sentence) overview of what happens in the story.
- Identify the title and author of the *secondary* source (the article). Tell what idea from the article interests you most.
- Write a thesis statement (one sentence) that tells why you find this one idea interesting.

Body

- Support your thesis by referring to the story (*primary source*) and the article (*secondary source*).
- Include at least two quotes from the story (*primary source*) to support your thesis. Include in-text citation (author's last name.)

• Include at least two quotes from the secondary source. Include in-text citation (author's last name).

Conclusion

- Restate (not repeat) your thesis.
- Sum up your main ideas.

Work Cited Page

• Include a separate Work Cited page following MLA format. Scroll down for the citation for the primary source (story). Copy the citation from the secondary source (literary article).

Academic Integrity Pledge

• Write a brief statement in which you tell in your own words why plagiarism is not a smart thing to do. Pledge that you have not engaged in it.

Citations for the stories:

Notice that a hanging indent should be used. That means indent for every line after the first one. Double space and put sources in alphabetical order.
