Poetry Presentation Directions

Using Canva, another design program, or a simple Microsoft Word program, create a 2-page presentation with images and text based on a poem of your choice. You can design the flyer in any style you want; however, in order to receive full credit, the flyer must contain the following elements:

- Title and author of the poem
- Full text of the poem
- A 150-word (at least) *personal reflection* about the poem that explains:
 1. how you located the poem;
 2. why you chose the poem;
 3. what specific language/phrasing in the poem (quoted words/lines) has meaning for you and why
- A short featured quote from the poem to catch readers' attention
- A short biography of the poet that includes only this specific information:
 1. Date and location of birth/death
 2. Specific themes/subjects favored by the poet
 3. One unusual fact about the poet's life (Please incorporate this into the bio; no special "fun facts" section)
- Copyright-free images (at least 3) with attribution and copyright designation
- Citation for biographical information from BMCC library database
- Your name, class, and Section number

Choice of Poem

Poems must come from either the [Poetry Foundation](#) or [Academy of American Poets](#).

Poems must be at least 12 lines in length.

Biographical Information

The biographical data about the poet must come from a BMCC library database (*Biography Reference Center or Biography Reference Bank are two good options*). Do not copy and paste information; put it in your own words.

Somewhere on the flyer, you must give the citation. This is given on the database page and can be copied and pasted.

Image Attribution

All images must be given attribution and should be licensed for reuse.

To find, copyright-free images:

- Do a Google image search.
- On the image tool bar, click “Tools” on the far right.
- Under “Tools,” click “Usage Rights.”
- Under “Usage Rights,” click “Creative Commons Licenses.”
- When you find an image you want, click to visit its page.
- Search the page to find the license; e.g. Public Domain, CC0, Share-Alike 2.0, etc.

You can be creative in how you incorporate the attributions into your flyer.
