L switched the red small ball to only have the ball in her right hand. L keeps continuing switching the red ball back and forth in each arm and begins to put her mouth on the ball. She uses her arms and both legs bending to lift up. L then begins to let go of using her legs to go back laying on her stomach and lifts the ball above her head to lower it on the floor. end of observation.

		During this observation Severina is playing blocks with caregivers during playtime. They are playing the game called "knock knock". s has on a dark blue long sleeve shirt with white stripes going across, with pink pants, no shoes or socks on, blonde hair, white color complexion. During playtime with a caregiver it uses her right hand to knock on a block-made door. the caregiver begins to respond telling s it is a toy cat and s begins to smile. s begins to knock on the block-made door again and the caregiver begins to respond by telling s it is a toy dog this time and s begins to smile. Each time she opens and shuts the door and sees how the cat and dog every knock her smile grows larger and larger. the caregiver and s begin to play back and forth with the play toy block door. The caregiver and s continue to play with one another but s noticed that the caregiver could not keep up with her when she was opening and closing the door, then noticed she did not see the dog. She puts her point finger towards her lips and tells the caregiver to "shh" while using her right index finger to cover her mouth before opening and closing the door two more times. S physical presence and gestures are using her hand or knuckles to knock on the

		door and using her finger tips to pry the door open. She is comfortable with using her hands and also knows when to use her hand. She communicates with the caregiver as they play with the block toys.

I was not able to observe if Derek was able to sit up or hold objects due to the length of video. Descriptive Review: During this observation, the infant name is Derek. D appears to be the age of 2 months old. D has a caramel skin complexion, he is also a twin, he has on a white and blue stripe baseball theme number "32" onise on with a slight of red in the onesie, he also does not have as much hair on head. D appears to be at playtime with his sibling. D stays on his right hand side while having his right hand in his mouth and is looking in the direction of the caregiver. D begins to notice a play toy animal which is a bee next to the caregiver and begins to use the right side of his body for support to lean up and uses his upper body strength to crawl to the toy. D uses his left hand to grasp the play toy bee and continues to tap on the toy while having right hand arm on his side to give him steady posture. He continues to tap on the toy but loses his balance and falls on his right hand side. While still using both hands to tap on the bee toy D uses his upper body strength to lean back up to continue to play with the toy. Observation ended.

Reflection Review: I believe infant "K" and caregiver have a good connection with one another. Infant "K" was aware of everything that was going on in the

area with the caregiver. She understood that she was being changed and the caregiver made sure to explain what she was doing with her. **Descriptive Review:** Kelly is wearing a baby blue long dress, she has no shoes on, her hair is out going down to her back with a bang. She is laying down on the diaper changer while the caregiver is beginning to change her diaper. The caregiver places infant "K" flat on her back and begins a countdown "321 legs in the air" to place the new diaper on infant "K". infant "K" follows along helping the caregiver to put diapers on. The Caretaker then says to infant "K": "you're all dry now you feel good now let's get ready for lunch and put a new dress on you". Infant "K" responds "na na na na"and the caregiver responds back by saying "na na na na" smiling. Caregiver then picks up infant "K", infant "K"
standing on her two feet " we are going to change you out of your wet dress into a new dress". Infant "K" places her hands in the air for the blue wet dress to be taken off and stands on her own on the diaper changer. Caregiver places the blue wet dress into the dirty clothes bin and tells infant "K" let's go put on some new clothes"and the caregiver picks up infant "K"and leaves in the diaper area.
Conclusion: During my observation and using all of the objective observation techniques to identify a child developmental domain I noticed that infant "K" had reached their developmental domains for her age group. However, she does not speak as much during this observation. She understands what's going on and what the caregiver is doing to her but does not speak, She does make sound effects but nothing else. Being able to have the opportunity to watch the videos of toddlers over and over again gives more of an insight when writing the descriptive review because you capture more. Meaning that when you think you have every detail and you replay the video again you see something new and different that you missed the first time watching the video. It made it very easy to write an anecdotal record and a checklist. However, when it came to writing a running record it was kind of difficult because you can't stop, pause or even replay the video when doing this technique due to the fact that it is timed and it's like you write what you see at that very moment in time.

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
