What makes you unique?

Activities:

- Self Portraits Stations: Students will create self portraits by using different art supplies.
- I Love My Locks: Students will various colored yarn, construction paper and silly string to create their hair
- Song: Students will sing "Everybody is Different" by Pipalupa and then create lyrics referring to what makes them different

Family


Activities:

- Family Trees: Students will create family trees to represent who makes up their families

What's in a Name?

Activities:

- Name Making Stations: Students will create name blocks while visiting the sandpaper letters, bubble wrap, bead, feather and shell stations
- Song and Movement: Students will gather in a large circle to sing along to "Willoughby Wallaby Woo" and tossing a stuffed elephant to peers across the room
- Name Cookies: Students will make cookies of various shapes and sizes to decorate with supplies such as frosting, sand sugar, edible flowers etc

What are Emotions?

Activities:

- **Emotion Slime:** Students will make slime to represent emotions such as joy, anger, fear, sadness to showcase their emotions in different situations
- Expressive Cartoons: Students will design cartoons of various expressions using materials such as leaves, shells, fabric and paper scraps
- Song and Movement: Students will sing "Happy and you Know it" while act out the movements. To portray other emotions, change the feeling and action as a class
