what NAEYC standards 2, 3, and 5 mean to me in the context of teaching children with special needs or special gifts is standard 2 means to me by successful early childhood education relies on collaborations with children's families and communities, as those preparing me in early childhood degree programs recognize it also means to me by how to make specific lessons to those students what are their interests and by that my lesson will match that and in creating a daily schedule that maximizes children's learning through efficient use of time, resources for play, selfdirected learning, and creative expression, and allows children to study individually and in groups based on their developmental needs and interests.

NAEYC standard 3 mean to me in the context of teaching children with special needs or special gifts by teaching me how to observe or watch how

some children act in class or outside class and communicate or teach them the way they like and want, by also giving me structured and unstructured strategies, as well as adult and child-directed solutions, are available. In my own field experience, I have made lessons but not any lessons I made lessons that focusses on my children's interest's, experiences, learning styles, needs, and capacities so that standard helped me to achieve that by showing me the strategies I can use.

finally, NAEYC standard 5 mean to me in the context of teaching children with special needs or special gifts by getting to know more about each child's health and how important it is and how it might affect their education journey, and how to make healthy choices for them and to educate them how to do so for themselves, I remember one time in when I was doing my field work the teachers knew for sure that there is some students that are allergic to some foods they give in class so they used to let them sit in a separate table from the rest of the of the class and the teachers used to make sure that they do not touch the same food or things from different

tables just to show how important and meaningful this experience and standard 5 to me and what taught me.
