While observing a classroom in Early Childhood Education, educators must be equipped and organized for the children to learn and interact with their peers and teachers. Teachers are responsible for the children in the classroom when they are conducting activities in the classroom environment. According to the reading, Listen to what we hear developing community responsive listening centers by Emily Brown Hoffman and Kristin Cipollone Fall 2021 "the goal of this partnership was twofold: to offer a unique learning experience to future and current educators, and to support the center's efforts to enhance its literacy and language resources to be responsive to the children and families it serves."(pg 7) Children have the opportunity to learn while being in class environments where they can discover and have experiences with materials provided around the classroom teachers should encourage them to participate when it comes to these types of activities and evaluate the progress of the children because this will also help the teacher learn with their development of each and everyone in her classroom while observing. Its goal is to use social awareness and interpersonal skills to establish and maintain positive relationships. Students need opportunities to have meaningful, purposeful learning discussions".(pg45).
