THE JOURNALISM AND MEDIA STUDIES PROGRAM (JAMS) is dedicated to the teaching of journalism as a public service. Our students create acts of journalism that harness the power of multiple digital platforms to communicate journalistic truths and to give their reading, watching, listening and networked audiences the stories they need to understand, engage and make informed decisions across all facets of their lives.

Students distribute and publish their work through a variety of community and student-run media outlets such as 411Sports, BRIC, The Vanguard, the Brooklyn News Services and Brooklyn College Radio. In their senior year, all students take Digital News Laboratory in which they cover breaking news as part of a 'real-world newsroom' and an intensive Capstone in JAMS in which they develop their own online portfolios and engage in collective and individual acts of entrepreneurial journalism.

JAMS alumni can be found at news outlets and organizations such as: News12, NY1, Democracy Now, WNYC Radio/Radio Rookies, CNN, MLB Network, CBS Radio, ESPN, Witness.org, and NBC/MSNBC as well as doing graduate work at: Quinnipiac University, the UC Berkeley Graduate School of Journalism, Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism, and the Craig Newmark Journalism School of Journalism at CUNY.
