If however you do not support your group and do not share your work or at least make suggestions to another group member's work.... Your evaluation [grade] will suffer.

Please DO use the group area to support and collaborate on all assignments. Especially if you struggle expressing yourself in writing for whatever reason [not your bag, not your first language, you mom is an English teacher and you are rebelling, your HS didn't bother teaching

you... whatever] use the group as a support system to ensure that you submit assignments that read appropriately for an academic setting.

#### This does not mean others should do your work for you, but they can help you express your ideas in the best way possible.

#### Get some advice, try out your ideas, etc

This takes a little processing time so you cannot submit your individual work the day the group assignment is due. You need to get it done a few days before.

Different groups have different dynamics. Also you will definitely have group members who ghost the group. That is their choice. Do your best to work with the folks who are there. Again. Every student is expected to do the assignment-- everyone is expected to do the reading, watch the lectures, and watch the film(s).

The project will ask you to analyze a scene and discuss the core elements that help drive the story forward and elicit emotion. These are the choices the filmmaker made that you think help give meaning to the scene (*besides the dialog and the acting*).

Part II: You will then compare your scene to a scene from class.

It consists of a series of steps

# PART I Steps

1. Choose a short scene from your favorite film (the one you mentioned in the opening post) -- choose a scene

where you think there are aspects of cinematography, editing, mise en scene and sound that emphasize the narrative and amplify the emotion.

**2.** Fill out the Mise En Scene worksheet for your scene (part of an Ind/Group assignment)

3. Fill out the Cinematography worksheet (part of an Ind/Group assignment)

4 Fill out the Editing worksheet (part of an Ind/Group assignment)

5. Fill out the Sound worksheet (part of an Ind/Group assignment)

6. Complete the worksheet: After you have considered the elements, discern which elements you think are effective in emphasizing the content of the scene and amplifying the emotion. Formulate a thesis using three or four specific elements that you think are worthy of consideration. You should not discuss every possible element, you should choose the ones that you think are important. These should be specific: not cinematography but perhaps depth of field, framing, camera movement etc. not mise en scene but setting, blocking, props, etc. not sound but diegetic sound, music, silence etc. For example, in Citizen Kane, Welles uses framing, lighting, blocking, and the musical score to accentuate the oppressive feeling that Susan has and the maniacal control of Kane in the Jigsaw scene (7 seconds - 1:56 here)

7. Revise the worksheet after feedback from Your Peers, Sloves, and Mohammad. This also includes reevaluating the scene for anything you might've missed.

**8.** Write an outline An outline for an essay about your scene and the elements that you think emphasize the content and amplify the emotion. Be sure to include your thesis statement in the introduction portion of your outline.

**9.** Write a rough draft (600-1000 up to 2000 max words on the first part)

PART II

10. Choose a scene from a narrative fiction film **from class** to compare your scene with.

11. Write a shorter essay comparing a scene from class and the scene you chose. (note turn this in with the rough draft)

**12.** Write a final draft

**13.** Give a video summary of what you discussed in your scene and your comparison (but DO NOT READ YOUR PAPER) in a 3-5 min video that you post on YouTube -- and then submit the link.

This project will be one of the 3 major elements that will comprise your grade. The other two are the weekly work, and the final. I will use a sliding scale to give you maximal benefit but only if you have done all 3 in good faith.

# Step 1 Choose A Scene

The scene should not be any longer than 3 minutes (it can be shorter)... you can tell me where to start and stop in a larger clip if necessary.

You should choose your scene with the following in mind -

Think about any interesting ways that it uses mise en scene, cinematography, editing and sound to create emotion and help develop the narrative. How are these essential elements used to drive the story forward.

So choose your scene wisely -- if it is a fun scene that doesn't really do much narratively it might be hard to complete this assignment .
