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Photo-Essay Assignment – Political Participation (The personal is political)

Description

In this assignment, you will have the opportunity to attend a political event that takes place either in person or online. A political event may be, for example, a public debate between politicians or scholars on societal issues, a public protest or demonstration with a political cause in any open space, a political party's convention, a trade union meeting, volunteering for a candidate during elections, etc. You may observe a live or a virtual event organized by BMCC or other CUNY school or organization in New York City, either in person or via Zoom. Most importantly, the purpose of the event **must be political!**

During your attendance, you would need to take 10-15 photographs, which you will then use to create a photo-essay for the purpose of describing and evaluating what went on during that event. Your photo-essay should be between **1100-1200** (or more if you wish) words in length, incorporating the following:

- 1. A title page that includes your name, name of the event you have attended, and one of your photos as a "cover" image.
- 2. A 200-300-word <u>introduction</u> to the images, describing in detail what action, event or campaign did you attend. If it was a virtual event, you need to include the link. In this case, your 10-15 photographs must be screenshots.
- 3. Then, your 10–15 images will follow, each on a single page and preferably centered on the page. Each image must feature a title or caption in the following format: Your name, Title or Caption, Location of Photograph, Event Name, and Date.
- 4. Then, provide a narrative context for your images by telling a story. This will be a 750-1000-word analysis of the photos where you:
 - a. Think critically of the separate items at the event: themes, goals, speakers, etc.
 - b. Note the successes or failures of the event based on your judgment.
 - c. Use course material that we have discussed in class to relate on themes, topics or ideas that relate to your project.
 - d. <u>You may also use material from other sources (up to 5)</u> in the specific context of the event that you attended. These may be media coverage, books, journals, etc.
- 5. Conclude your essay by considering the following questions:
 - a. Elaborate on the importance of political participation. Why does it matter now more than in the past? Think of the event you had attended in a broader context, for example, the COVID-19 pandemic, the war in Ukraine, the economy, racial

inequality, polarization in Congress and US society, climate change, or other current challenges the nation faces.

- b. What are your feelings about the event: theme, speaker, people's participation, outcome, etc.?
- c. What challenges/concerns did you face?
- d. Would you participate in any political activity in the future? Why yes or why not?

Format and Style

- 1100-1200 (or more) words, Times New Roman, double-spaced, 12-point size, 1-inch margins.
- Word Format preferred.
- MLA or Chicago Manual style for references.
- Bibliography (not included in the word count requirement).
