

## Open Pedagogy Activity: Analyzing a Play Material e-Book

### Instructions

Over the semester, you expanded your understanding of infant development and how various play materials support infant development. This project will allow you to apply your insights and to share them with a larger audience. This project has 2 parts:

- Part 1: Analyzing the Play Material
- Part 2: Developing your e-Book page

### Part 1: Analyzing Your Play Material

1. To begin, identify 2 or 3 other people to work with so you in a group of 3 or 4 people
2. Identify an open-ended play materials that the group would like to explore and share
  - Moon sand
  - Homemade finger paint
  - Water play
  - Sensory pit (similar to a ball pit)
  - Crawl/ walk through boxes for babies
3. After researching the open-ended play material, answer the questions in the chart below.

## Part 2: Developing your e-Book Page

1. After you have analyzed your play material, begin to think about you want to share the material in the e-Book of Play Materials for Infant Teachers. This book is available to all infant teachers on the internet.
2. Your page in the e-Book should include the following information:
  - a. What is the name of the play material?
  - b. How infant teachers can make the play material and the supplies they will need?
  - c. How would an infant teacher set-up the activity for non-mobile and mobile infants?
  - d. How the play material support development for non-mobile and mobile infants?
  - e. How might the non-mobile and mobile infants explore the materials?
  - f. What domains of development and milestones are supported by the play material for non-mobile and mobile infants?
  - g. How does the play material support learning and development in the developmental domains for non-mobile and mobile infants?
  - h. How does the play material connect to current literature/ 3 assigned course readings?
3. Begin to think about the layout and design of your page. How do you want your page to look?
  - a. What information should be in paragraph form?
  - b. What information should be bulleted?
  - c. What information should be supported with a photograph?
  - d. How many photos should you have (we will discuss how to find fair use photos)?
4. Assign roles and tasks among group members.
