

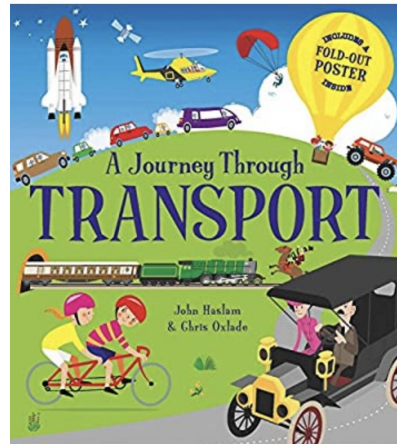
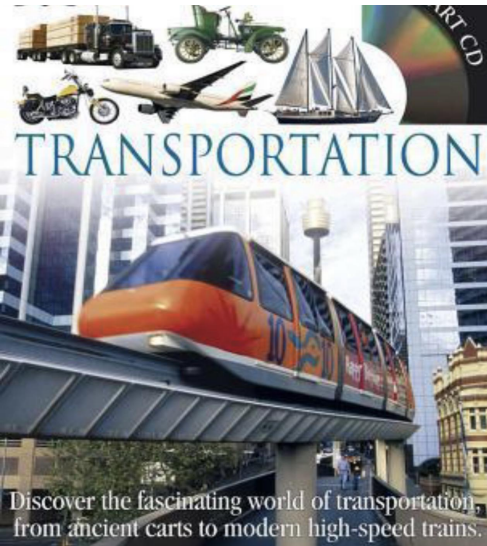
Transportation
