Immigration and Separation of Children from their Families

Former President Trump has often claimed the US has become overcrowded through the illegal entry by undocumented, dangerous immigrants. In 2017 the Trump administration instituted the new zero tolerance immgration policy. His policies included separating undocumented parents from their childrenat the U.S Mexico border. According to in the article, "Family Separation May Have Hit Thousands More Migrant Children Than Reported" (2019), it was reported that nearly 3,000 children were forcibly separated from their parents under last year's "zero tolerance" immigration policy, under which nearly all adults entering the country illegally were prosecuted, and any children accompanying them were put into shelters or foster care. Many families began to face all this trauma starting 4 years ago. Children were put in jail cell-like rooms, and they were treated like prisoners as well, and as the years progressed the rooms kept filling up with more children. They were not given any food, any water and they were treated like animals. On February 15, 2019, Trump signed a \$328 billion spending bill that included \$1.375 billion in funding for barriers on the southern border. In my opinion Trump was very unprofessional with his job and duties as president, he has separated parents from their children for racist reasons. I.C.E will knock on peoples doors and take away children's parents, while children would watch as their parents were taken away, which is very traumatizing and painful to watch. "The mission of the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) is to protect America from the cross-border

crime and illegal immigration that threaten national security and public safety." Yet, they allowed innocent children to watch as their innocent parents were unexplainably ripped from their home.
