Colombian Traditions

"El Dia de Las Velitas"

One of the main colombian tradition is "El Dia de Las Velitas". Día de las Velitas (Day of the Little Candles) is a Colombian tradition of lighting rows and rows of candles on the night of December 7 to celebrate the proclamation of the Immaculate Conception.



Carnaval de Negros y Blancos

The Black and White Carnival is when private homes comes together as collective individuals to display the art of the carnival. A wide range of people from all over the country come together to express their views of life. The festival is especially important as the expression of a mutual desire for a future of tolerance and respect.



Quemar el año viejo (Burning the 'old year' doll)

A puppet that is dressed in ancient clothing and burnt to bring luck in the New Year is known as a "old year," or Ao Viejo. This long-standing custom, which is primarily practiced in small communities, serves as a metaphor for letting go and holding out hope for a better future.

Colombian Clothing

Colombian attire is very bright and colorful!

- In the coastal region clothing is loose and colorful
- In the cooler region, people wear woolen/heavy cotton "Ruanas".

Clothes depends on climate/location. The most popular costume is the Pollera Colora. The Ruana is the most common item in the cooler regions.

Typical clothes would be shorts, t-shirts and dress due to the weather.

Colombia's music/dance are separated into four distinct zones. (The Andes, The Atlantic, The Caribbean & The Pacific.)

Andes: Bambuco

Atlantic: Cumbia/Salsa

Pacific: Guasa/Mapale

Caribbean: Cumbia/Vallenato

Crafts
