## Creative Project Pt 1 (outline)

Theatre needs to include all of these aspects in order to create a mindset to work.

#### - Character analysis

The process of creating a character - your ability to explore different aspects and make the character any way you want. Character analysis gives you a chance to truly understand a character and their motives. You are also able to truly understand a character and the people around them.

#### - Directing

Directing is the person who moves and makes everything realistic. They are able to make all the aspects that come together and make the actors move around realistically
