

# TASTE



Have you ever wondered why sometimes you taste something and it can either go really good or even really bad? It's your tongue and the roof of your mouth are covered with thousands of tiny taste buds. When you eat something, the saliva in your mouth helps break the food down. This provides your taste buds with a message to your brain telling you what flavors you are tasting.


# SMELL



The nose is the body's primary organ of smell and also functions as part of the body's respiratory system. Air comes into the body through the nose. As it passes over the specialized cells of the olfactory system, the brain recognizes and identifies smells. Hairs in the nose clean the air of foreign particles.



From the moment you wake up to the time you go to sleep, your eyes are like a video camera. Everything you look at is sent to your brain for processing and storage. Sight is the most complex of the five senses.



The other four senses are located to a specific body part, but the sense of touch is found all over. Touch can be found from head to toe. Your hands can also be to grab and hold things.



The middle of your ear is an air-filled cavity that turns sound waves into vibrations and delivers them to the inner ear. Your ears serve as two very important purposes. Your ears also helps you to hear sounds as well as to help your balance.



Children will continue to learn through play of exploration with an exciting topic focused on "We Have Five Senses" Together children will explore, investigate, and understand themselves and our world. Children naturally will explore the world around them through each of their sense. In this Unit, children will focus on developing the Physical Development and Health Skills described in Domain 2. Using their senses to assist and guide learning throughout play. Children will demonstrate increasing awareness and understanding of safety rules. Children will also learn to identify what senses they are using in certain activities provided. Children will be engaged, and informative. Literary texts provide opportunities for exploring content, expressing ideas using one's imagination, and critical thinking that are enhanced through multiple readings, songs and activities.




#### **Activity:**

#### **Activity:**


- Apple Paint Tree Art Center - Creativity

#### **Activity:**


- Apple Test Tasting

  - Children will create an apple chart. Children will be able to put their name under what apple color they liked the most. After children will use their math skills and count what apple has more likes.




#### **Activity:**


# SMELL SWATCHES


# SMELL SWATCHES


# EXPLORING WHAT WE SEE


#### **Activity:**
