In one of John Wick movies there was a scene where John Wick and some older guy had a match up in the rain which led to John Wick being stabbed in the stomach and the old guy being stabbed in the shoulder. The camera cuts and movements become more frantic and frequent as the fight scene begins. The scene starts off with a medium shot of an old guy on a dark rainy night then cuts to John Wick walking towards him. The camera Pans out to reveal that they're on some sort of pier somewhere as the two begin to fight. The film makers' use of low key lighting is to help create a dark and stormy mood in which I think helps the scene feel more grounded and less chaotic than the rest of the film. The use of only rain noises and the character's voices helps to create a sense of emptiness as it's only John Wick and the older guy along with a sense of tension surrounding their one on one duel. This scene's use of dark and muted colors could be used to convey an uneasy or an unwelcoming environment for the viewers as well as the scene being a dark stormy night. I think the type of mic they use is omnidirectional because of the fact that you don't just hear their voices but you can hear the rain pretty clearly as well. I think what the filmmakers were trying to do was create a dark and ominous scene that starts off very quiet and tense up until the fight scene where the moment gets very heated and frantic as the two fight and then gets quiet and less tense at the beginning of the scene. I believe that filmmakers were trying to express an intense battle between two highly skilled fighters to see who comes out on top and I think the work they put in to pull off this scene really paid off in the end.
